Dropped Ball

There are a variety of times during a match where you might see the referee re-start the match with a "dropped ball." This week, I'd like to tell you about some of the times you might expect to see this and how it is properly conducted.

Essentially, a dropped ball is used when the referee has stopped the match for something other than a foul or most other infractions of the Laws. Here are some circumstances that might precipitate a dropped ball:

- (1) A player is injured and the referee stops the match to have the player attended to. This is certainly the most common reason for the dropped ball.
- (2) An "outside agent" interferes with play. This could include a spectator entering the field and interfering with play (watch those little brothers and sisters, please!), or another ball getting in the way of play.
- (3) Misconduct (yellow and red card offences) taking place off the field of play for which the referee stops play in order to handle the situation. This could include substitutes, coaches and spectators misbehaving. It also could include a player committing misconduct off the field of play (e.g., while temporarily off the field of play, she hits someone).
- (4) The referee inadvertently blows the whistle. This is a little embarrassing, but it does happen!

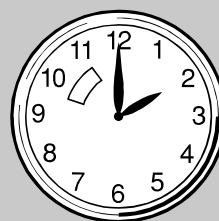
The dropped ball procedure is fairly simple. The drop is usually made at the location where the ball was when play was stopped. The referee holds the ball waist-high and drops it to the ground. The ball is in play when it hits the ground. If a player contacts the ball prior to it hitting the ground, the ball is re-dropped. If the ball hits the ground and rolls over the touch line or goal line without being touched by a player, it is re-dropped. The player that contacts the ball first after it hits the ground may play it again before it is played by another player. (This is unlike any of the other restarts.)

There is no requirement for any specific number of players to be nearby when the drop occurs. Often there will be one player from each team, but there are circumstances where the referee will drop the ball to only one player from one team. For example, if the goal keeper has the ball in her possession and the referee needs to stop play to deal with an injury, then out of basic fairness, he will drop the ball to her, making sure that that no opponents are around. Anything else would not be fair.
